RESPECT LIFE.....Building a Culture of Life

Respecting the Dignity of all God's People

This Sunday is World Leprosy Day. Even though Leprosy (Hansen's disease) is curable millions of people throughout the world are living with this disease.

St. Marianne Cope (1838-1918) whose feast day was January 23rd devoted her life to caring for those suffering with leprosy. In 1883, at the request of the King of Hawaii, St. Marianne Cope along with six Franciscan sisters traveled to the Hawaiian Islands to open hospitals and to care for those stricken with Leprosy (Hansen's disease). For the last 30 years of her life, Mother Marianne of Molokai as she became known chose to be exiled on the island of Molokai where she cared for women and children with leprosy. St. Marianne Cope believed in and worked tirelessly for the dignity of every human being. She saw in every person, especially those debilitated by leprosy the beauty and value of human life. She saw in them the suffering face of Christ.

Mother Marianne of Molokai pray for us and for those suffering with diseases of every kind.
