**The Life of Blessed Margaret Castello**

"Blessed Margaret (1287-1320) was born a hunchback, midget, blind, lame, and ugly. When she was 6, her proud, noble parents walled her up beside a chapel. She could not get out, but could attend Mass and receive the Sacraments. After 14 years of imprisonment, her parents took her to a shrine to pray for a cure. When no cure was forthcoming, they abandoned her. She became a lay Dominican and spent the rest of her life in prayer and works of mercy. When she died at age 33, the townspeople thronged to her funeral and demanded that "the saint" be buried in a tomb inside the church. The priest protested but when a crippled girl was miraculously cured at the funeral, the people had their way. Her body is still incorrupt."

St. Mary's Goes To War: Annapolis Catholics

During the Civil War

Dr. Worden will share an overview of the book and research he is working on regarding how the Civil War impacted the lives of the Redemptorist priests and St. Mary's parishioners.

Robert Worden, Ph.D., spent 34 years on the research staff of the Library of Congress. At the Library, he authored and edited more than 100 books and analytical studies on historical and contemporary topics. He and his wife, Norma, have been parishioners of St. Mary's since 1971, and both have volunteered for a variety of parish activities over the years. Dr. Worden has served as the archivist and historian for St. Mary's Church since 1982. He is a co-founder of the Annapolis History Consortium and currently serves on the City of Annapolis Heritage Commission.

**Middle School Youth Ministry:** We have completed our final session of the year: **The Mystery of the Mass**. Our hopes were to help the students understand the Mass better, and therefore enjoy and appreciate it more. Last Monday (Apr. 4<sup>th</sup>), the students gathered in their small groups again and reflected on the journey of the past three weeks, processing what they learned and sharing their new insights. Then they returned to large group and competed against one another in a Mass Trivia competition. **DO NOT FORGET:** One of the key points stressed is that during Mass we are **PARTICIPANTS**, not observers. We have an active role in the Mass, and how much we get out of the Mass is determined by how much we're willing to give ourselves to it. Christ is offering us his heart at Mass...do you offer yours back to him? Are you there to do so? If not, start coming regularly now...we will be better with you!

We will be **ON BREAK next week**, Apr. 11th. The following Monday, April 18th, we will have our last class where we will conclude our year with our annual **Fun Day** from 4:30pm to 6:00pm. All 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, and 8<sup>th</sup> grade students are welcome and encouraged to join us! As a friendly reminder, many parents volunteered to make treats that day...thanks!

We will be participating in a regional **Summer Madness** program this summer from July 25<sup>th</sup>-29<sup>th</sup>. It is an opportunity for Middle School students (current 6<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> graders in the 2015/2016 school year) to take part in service activities, meet students from other parishes (make new friends), and have fun. Each day (Monday - Thursday) the students will go to a different service site in the morning and help serve. They will return for lunch together, and then we'll all go have fun in the afternoon (bowling, laser-tag, mini-golf, etc.). On Friday, July 29th, we'll all go to Hershey Park for the day (the Hershey Park trip is **ONLY** open to students who are participating in Summer Madness). Summer Madness can not happen without parents helping (Child Protection trained and cleared parents). Flyers with more details and permission forms have been e-mailed to parents, and are also available in the box on the Business Office door in the church lobby. Space is limited, and is first come, first serve.

**High School Youth Ministry:** This past Sunday, Apr. 3rd, we began **Session 4**; our topic will focused on Pope Francis' most recent encyclical (or letter to the world) on the environment entitled, "**On Care For Our Common Home**." Our first meeting was more of an overview of the Pope's letter. The universe was created by God out of love; everything within it expresses the love of God, and points back to God. Human beings are uniquely created in the image of God, to be loved by God, and to love and help God care for all of creation. However, instead of seeing creation as a precious gift from God, our self-absorption encourages us to view creation as objects, even other human beings. Pope Francis wants to help us rediscover our dignity, the deep connection we have with all of creation, and our responsibility to care for it...not because we have to, but because we love all creation and God in return. Like Father Raff, Pope Francis wants us to Think, Think, Think...and to educate ourselves; to practice and do not underestimate little daily actions; to think positive about changing the world; to focus on family; to learn to appreciate beauty in everything; to recognize care for the common home as a moral issue...and a spiritual exercise; and to practice gratitude. Praise be to you, our Lord.

Sunday, Apr. 10th we will continue our investigation into the Pope's encyclical, as we focus on how **care for the environment is inseparable from care for myself and one another, especially the poor**. You don't want to miss it. All high school students are welcome!

The Archdiocese's Mission Office is sponsoring the annual **Haiti Trip** for students aged 16-20 on July 10-16. Students spend a week in Haiti running a day camp for younger Haitian students at a school in St. Marc. Deadline for submitting applications to the Archdiocese has passed. We have 5 students applying...we'll keep you posted on their acceptance.

Our **Spring Retreat** is approaching (April 29th - May 1st). We'll be heading to Camp Letts in Edgewater, MD and our theme is entitled "Pathways." We have a great time on retreat, and all high school students who regularly attend our Sunday evening faith formation meetings are welcome and encouraged to join us! Flyers will be e-mailed to parents soon and will soon be available in the box on the Business Office door in the church lobby.

Finally, again this summer we are sending teams out for our **Work Camp trips**. One team will be heading into Baltimore City (June 19-25), and one team will be going to Terra Alta, West Virginia (June 26-July 2); teams from OLC consist of at least 5 students and 2 adults. Our teams will be joining many other students from parishes around the Archdiocese of Baltimore to perform "Habitat for Humanity" type work for the week. Flyers are **NOT AVAILABLE YET** but will be soon. **The expenses for the Baltimore and Appalachia trips are \$350 per person. For both work camp trips, we're asking the students to pay for part of their expenses (\$175), and we're hoping parishioners will consider sponsoring students for the remainder of their expenses (\$175 per student, although partial sponsorship is also welcome).** We have asked this of you in years past, and you have supported us amazingly; we are grateful! We know things are tight in this economy, but this is a worthwhile investment! **SPECIAL NOTE:** We are in need of an adult team (2 adults) to take our students to the Baltimore Work Camp on June 19-25. Please let Tim know if you are interested and able. (Construction experience in not required, but helpful. Being good role models for young people IS REQUIRED.)

**Wednesday Night Group:** Our Wednesday Night Group is a **voluntary faith formation group** for high school students. If you are in 9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade and you're interested in pursuing your faith beyond what we do Sunday evening, AND in a relaxed setting, come join us please! (Note: Our Sunday evening meetings are wonderful with great content; the WNG is more relaxed, and yet deeper discussions.) While we have evenings of deep discussion on matters of faith, current events, and prayer, we also include evenings of community building, such as games, fun field trips, and service. So...if you are in 9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade, come join us please Wednesday evenings from 6:30pm to 8:30pm. Here's our schedule for the couple weeks.
