St. Jeanne Jugan

Jeanne Jugan was born in France during the French Revolution. At the age of 15, Jeanne became a kitchen maid for a family that not only cared for its own members, but also served the poor and elderly. Ten years later Jeanne became a nurse at a hospital. Soon, thereafter she joined a third order group. She prayed, visited the poor and taught catechism to children. Mother Marie of the Cross as Jeanne became know, founded houses for the elderly which were all staffed by members of her association---the Little Sisters of the Poor. By 1879 there were 2,400 Little Sisters of the Poor. Jeanne died later that same year on August 30. She was canonized in 2009.

From the Desk of Sister Sally...

Resembling God: Gerald Darring

The God we worship is "the father of orphans and the defender of widows who gives a home to the forsaken and leads forth prisoners to prosperity and has made a home for the poor." The God we worship tells us: "when you have a reception, invite beggars and the crippled, the lame and the blind."

Does our ministry bear any resemblance to the God we worship? Do we provide shelter to homeless children? Do we stand up for the lonely elderly? Do we lead prisoners to prosperity? Do we make our church a home for the poor? Do we invite the helpless to our party?

Today's liturgy challenges us to a different lifestyle, one based on forgiveness, love and faith, humble living, the following of Jesus, who is gentle and lowly of heart, peace-making and suffering persecution, and service of others.

We know that we have responded to this challenge when we begin to resemble the God we worship, the "God who has made a home for the poor."

It is not merely a matter of 'giving from one's surplus,' but of helping entire peoples which are presently excluded or marginalized to enter into the sphere of economic and human development.

For this to happen, it is not enough to draw on the surplus goods which in fact our world abundantly produces; it requires above all a change of lifestyles, of models of production and consumption, and of the established structures of power which today govern societies

High School Youth Ministry and Confirmation

Time to Register Please

Our **2016-2017 High School Youth Ministry (HSYM) Program** is about ready to get underway; our first Sunday night class will be on September 25th from 6:30pm - 8:30pm (The tentative calendar for the year can be found on the parish website.) The beginning of our HSYM program is synonymous with the beginning of our Confirmation process. **Active participation in our HSYM program for two (2) consecutive years is part of our process before candidates are confirmed.**

First year AND Second year students need to register (even if you were registered last year). If you are not registered for the Confirmation process yet, you can do so online at www.olchesapeake.org (look for registration under "Religious Education"). Remember, we have never turned a student away for financial reasons, so if the registration fee is an issue, let us know, but we need you to register regardless please.

Our Confirmation process begins with a series of Intake Sessions for the First and Second year students. **Each year, one of these sessions MUST be attended by the 'Family Team'** which includes: the interested young person (candidate) and at least one parent; second year students must also bring their sponsor (**they all need to be at the same meeting**). First year students do not need to have a sponsor until next year, but they DO need to attend the meeting with a parent. The available Intake Sessions will be held **IN THE CHURCH** on:

Tuesday, Sept. 13th from 7-9pm

Saturday, Sept. 17th from 9-11am

Sunday, Sept. 18th from 5-7pm

Tuesday, Sept. 20th from 7-9pm

(note the different times)

Please register online BEFORE coming to the intake session. You are not considered part of the Confirmation Process unless you attend one of the Intake Sessions (**and are registered**).
