From the Desk of Sister Sally

Today's Gospel is a clear example of things, especially things
in and of the world, may not always be what they might seem
to be. The disciples saw Herod's temple, adorned with majes-
tic articles but they could not see the spiritual desolation be-
hind the façade. At the time, the temple's veneer hid hypoc-
risy, oppression and abject rejection of Christ.

Jesus warned his followers about false teachers as he knew
the untold secrets hidden by the grandeur of the temple. Je-
sus knew that external appearances and silver tongued
teachers can be deceivers. We are challenged to discern in
our daily lives the true and often underlying meaning of many
teachers of faith. St. Ignatius tells us to focus on both our
emotions and intellect to detect and listen to the movement of
the Holy Spirit within us as a key tool in seeing what may be
behind a potential false prophet.

Of course not all false prophets are religious. Indeed much of
the cacophony of information we are exposed to on a regular
basis includes things that are not as they may seem at first
glance. We see get-rich-quick schemes that preach a gospel
of stocks, bonds and real estate. There are all kinds of
schemers out there, some who will prey on the elderly and
the less fortunate in society. We must always practice active
discernment as a habit of our spiritual life- and not just in a
formal religious context but in all parts of our life.

The next admonition from Jesus to his followers and to us as
well is much harder to hear. We are not promised a worry-
free, easy life on earth. In fact, Jesus explicitly makes it clear
that his disciples will be hated and persecuted—but in those
painful moments are wonderful opportunities for us to mani-
fest our witness to the Gospel.

We who serve Christ in the world will inevitably face resis-
tance, recrimination for our faith and even persecution. We
however are promised hope, strength and support from
God—if we have the wisdom to trust in Him. The Holy Spirit
will carry us with God's thoughts and words when on our own
wisdom and effort we would be barren.

We all have moments of misery and insecurity—and these
voids in us cannot be filled with the trappings of the world,
money, success or worldly goods. Just like the temple exte-
rior that hid the unsettled interior, our external veneer may
not reflect our true interior disquiet. It is only through faith and
a vibrant relationship with Jesus can we can find meaning
and purpose, even when we are in painful or uncomfortable
encounters. We must become aware of the comfort that God
can give us by helping us turn negatives into positives, trage-
dies into triumphs, heartaches into moments of grace.
Our service will not be easy and it will be at times tiring. It's
hard to put others' needs ahead of our own. It's often difficult
for us to take the right path in our own lives when it is often
easier to take shortcuts. We need our imagination to see the
return of Jesus in His glory to help sustain us.

We should be comforted by the fact that we are not pioneers
but followers and that God will hold us in His heart throughout
all our life. by Mark Latta

High School Youth Ministry

We will be on break Sunday evenings until we resume again on Nov. 27th, when we begin Session 2. During Session 1 the students offered their input to our topic for Session 2, which is not set yet. But...it will have everything to do with working your faith into your everyday lives! All high school students are welcome and encouraged to join us!

We were on our **Fall Retreat** last weekend (Nov. 4th-6th). Almost 60 of us went to the Hashawha Environmental Center in Westminster, MD...and turned it into a spiritual center! We had an amazing time - the weather was terrific; the students were engaged, participatory, and joyful; the games were fun; the free time filled with hikes, sports, and naps; the small group sessions were interactive, personal, and faith-forming; and the prayer service and Mass with Fr. Raff were meaningful; Raff blessed us with a beautiful homily and really connected with us all! We are so proud of the students!

Our theme for the Retreat was “Baptism – Dive In to the Family of God”. Baptism is part of God's rescue plan to bring us back to Him and make us part of His family; it is rooted in his great love for us, revealed by Jesus' life, suffering, death, and resurrection, and the Holy Spirit living within us, guiding and gracing us. God wants us to have life to the fullest, and Baptism tells us that He will be helping us do that our every day of our lives. Baptism also tells us that we have a hand in our own success; we have work to do!
