## Pastor's Page

Hi Gang,

A kind parishioner forwarded to OLC the following beautiful words from his cousin who is a Jesuit missionary in Peru. He has been there for ~50 years:

*I saw the Pope!! I got to concelebrate his mass and so was only 45 feet from him. The 17 people who came with me had to be satisfied with the images on the gigantic screens.*

*It was really a special experience seeing the Pope, walking on the same ground, breathing the same air, but what really impressed us were the Ecuadorian people with whom Peru has had a number of wars.*

*The Ecuadorian Jesuits lent us a house to stay in and then the Director of Fe y Alegría Schools picked us up at the bus depot in his pickup and took us there: incredible attention. Some of us had beds, others slept on mats on the floor. That night we went to find a good place from which to see the Pope during his mass the next day. As we walked the two miles to the mass sight, many people, on seeing our Peruvian flag, stopped us to take pictures and congratulate us. That night I slept on a piece of cardboard on the asphalt: the temperature was about 80. But the following day the temperature rose to 100 degrees. I sweat a lot but resisted taking my jacket off. It was the only way to avoid sunburn.*

*Fortunately there was lots of free water. And the Ecuadorians shared their apples and sandwiches. Others tried to find medicines for those of us who were sick. Many suffered heat exhaustion but got good medical attention. One Ecuadorian woman's faith really impressed us because she would not eat anything until after the mass.*

*The Pope arrived at noon, 50 bishops and 400 priests were waiting, ready to concelebrate the mass. The theme of his homily was the family. He said three words are basic: asking PERMISSION, saying THANK YOU, and begging PARDON. He ended by saying "the future is not written, we must live in HOPE".*

*On the way home from the mass two people, who had gotten lost, were invited into a home for lunch and then driven to our house. We couldn't believe it had happened. When we left on Tuesday night, we had a completely different image of the Ecuadorian people. We had come to see the Pope but got to know the Ecuadorians.*

### CONSIDERING GLASSES FOR BETTER SIGHT?

I thought that was a pretty deal and want to pass on this tip to you guys!
