### ***From the Desk of Sister Sally:***

Christianity is about light. Just as Jesus is light to the world, so his church is to be light in a world of darkness. Light enables the beauty of things to be seen, and we are called to make the beauty of the world shine. But we are not to call attention to ourselves: if you are aware of the light in a room, it is too bright. Our vocation is for others, not ourselves.

Surrounded by discrimination, oppression and war, Christians are challenged to “be united in mind and judgment,” and they are directed by God’s love to “bring mankind to unity and peace.” The light we bring to the world should lead in time to an end of all the world’s darkness: the alienation and oppression of peoples, the attacks on human life and dignity, and disrespect for God’s creation.

## Middle School Youth Ministry

**Session 3** has begun and our theme is **Catholic Morality**...we will be investigating the theological roots and foundations of the Church's moral teachings, so that students can not only better decide WHAT they should morally do in a given situation, but WHY they should do it, and HOW. And, as always, it has everything to do with working your faith into your everyday lives!

Last Monday, Jan. 30<sup>th</sup>, we began at the source of Catholic Morality, which is **Image of God**. Because of God's infinite wisdom, God has eternally chosen to be a community of love. God found eternal happiness within Himself, within His loving community, and wanted to share that happiness with others; and so human beings were created. We were made by God in His image, which means we were made out of love, for love, to be loved, and to be loving. We were made by God in His image, which also means our lives have meaning, and we have the power to choose how we are to BE, even if that choice takes us away from how God made us to be. We were made by God in His image, which means if we live up to how God made us, as beings of love, then we too will share in eternal happiness. The core of Catholic Moral Teaching is not learning about right and wrong, it is learning about and getting in tune with the God of Love. Then you will KNOW right and wrong, and desire more to choose what is right and GOOD. To act morally good, you must not only remember WHO you are, but also WHO'S you are...you belong to God.

This Monday, Feb. 6<sup>th</sup>, we will continue our investigation into Catholic Morality as we look at **Conscience and Feelings**...and what that has to do with our everyday lives. All 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, and 8<sup>th</sup> graders are welcome and encouraged to join us from 4:30-6:30pm.

On Saturday, Feb. 25<sup>th</sup>, our MSYM is going **Snow Tubing at Liberty** Resort as part of a regional Anne Arundel County Youth Ministry trip. We're planning to visit either the Seton Shrine (where St. Elizabeth Ann Seton is buried) or the Grotto at Mount Saint Mary's, both in Emmitsburg, before stopping at Pizza Hut for lunch. Flyers and permission forms have been e-mailed to parents and are available in the box on the Business Office door in the church lobby.

## High School Youth Ministry

We have begun Session 3 called "**Catholic Talk**." Each week we will have a different guest speaker on a different topic. Parents are invited and encouraged to join us each week.

Last Sunday, Jan. 29<sup>th</sup>, our guest speaker was **Margaret Brogden**, the Director of Faith Formation at St. Clement Mary Hofbauer Church in Rosedale, MD, and she came to talk about moving from "**Tolerance to Holy Acceptance**." To all who are different, Jesus calls us to be more than tolerant, he calls us to be loving.

We will be on break this Sunday, Feb. 5<sup>th</sup>. The following Sunday, Feb. 12<sup>th</sup>, the former youth minister from Holy Family Parish in Davidsonville, MD, **Mike MacDonald**, is coming to speak about "**Sexuality and Pop Culture**." All high school students AND THEIR PARENTS are welcome and encouraged to join us from 6:30-8:30pm!

On Friday, January 27<sup>th</sup>, we (5 students and 1 adult) went to Washington, D.C. to take part in the **Rally and March for Life**. At the Rally before the March, we joined close to 15,000 other catholic high school students at the Verizon Center for a Rally with great music, talks, and a Mass. We then marched to the Mall where we listened to speeches in support of Life. Our students said they really enjoyed the day; we are proud of them!

We have our annual **Service Lock-in** scheduled for March 24<sup>th</sup> – 25<sup>th</sup>. Students will have opportunities throughout the lock-in to serve others (globally, locally, and even our parish), while having fun. Some of the service will be performed off-site, so we'll need Child Protection trained adult chaperones/drivers. It's too early for flyers and permission forms, but mark your calendars to save the date. We take the first 20 students!

## Wednesday Night Group

Our Wednesday Night Group is a **voluntary faith formation group** for high school students. If you are in 9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade and you're interested in pursuing your faith beyond what we do Sunday evening, AND in a relaxed setting, come join us please! (Note: Our Sunday evening meetings are wonderful with great content; the WNG is more relaxed, and yet deeper discussions.) While we have evenings of deep discussion on matters of faith, current events, and prayer, we also include evenings of community building, such as games, fun field trips, and service. And we've got some GREAT EATS! The schedule for the entire Winter/Spring (Jan. - April) has been e-mailed to parents, and we will post here in the bulletin the upcoming month's schedule. So...if you are in 9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade, come join us please Wednesday evenings from 6:30pm to 8:30pm. Here's our schedule for the next month...
