From the Desk of Sister Sally:

Where to Find Resurrection

Resurrection always eventually trumps crucifixion. What's good eventually triumphs. Thus, while nothing that's of God will avoid crucifixion, no body of Christ stays in the tomb for long. God always rolls back the stone and, soon enough, new life bursts forth and we see why that original life had to be crucified. ("Wasn't it necessary that the Christ should so have to suffer and die?") Resurrection invariably follows crucifixion. Every crucified body will rise again. Our hope takes its root in that.

The gospels speak to the heart and to the dream and to the road of discipleship that the disciples once walked with Jesus. Hope and enthusiasm were alive. And now, Easter Season 2017, compels us to respond from our hearts to the new life Jesus is giving us in this present time. And just as promised, Jesus appears!

However dark things are, goodness always re-emerges and spreads. Each day in our world beauty is born anew; it rises transformed through the storms of history. Values always tend to reappear under new guises, and human beings have arisen time after time from situations that seemed doomed.
